



#### **Rules for Ploughing:**

- 1. All ploughs to be ready to commence by 9:30am
- 2. All openings to be ready for judging at 10:30am
- 3. Plots not opened by 10:30am will not receive any points for their opening
- 4. All ploughing to be finished by 2pm
- 5. Ploughing to be no deeper than 6 inches
- 6. Three site markers allowed. Competitors to plough in the first mark
- 7. No assistance to any competitors except in Classes 5, 10, 11 & 12
- 8. Only competitors to be on the plot at any time
- 9. A Novice is someone who has never achieved 1<sup>st</sup> place in a ploughing class in any ploughing match
- 10. Competitors are kindly asked to do their best to ensure that their tractors comply with Farm Safety Regulations and the driver is of legal age. All drivers must be over 16 and have a minimum of a class F driving licence (for insurance purposes), apart from class 5 where all drivers must hold relevant insurance and have taken the tractor proficiency test. Cornwall YFC will not hold insurance for U16 entrants.
- 11. Certificates of proficiency and proof of insurance must be shown at entry.
- 12. One passenger may ride on a tractor at a time provided there is a seat for them.
- 13. The committee will not be held responsible for any damage, accidents or loss
- 14. Competitors should take care and be aware of telegraph poles and other obstacles which may be in the field.
- 15. Competitors are reminded to drive responsibly around the site at all times.
- 16. Class 11 can be won twice
- 17. Entries close on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2019

- 4. Competitors are reminded to drive responsibly in the field.

- 6. Sign in from 1:30pm Pulling to commence by 2pm

#### Recipe for Cornish Sticky Cake:

#### Ingredients:

#### For the Fruit Layer:

- 1 tablespoon golden syrup
- 50g (2oz) butter
- 25g (1oz) brown sugar
- 40g (1 ½ oz) flaked almonds
- 40g (1 ½ oz) glace cherries, quartered
- 25g (1oz) sultanas
- 25g (1oz) stem ginger, cut into small pieces

#### For the sponge mixture:

- 175g (6oz) soft butter
- 175g (6oz) caster sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 175g (6oz) self-raising flour
- 1 ½ teaspoons baking powder
- 1 heaped tablespoon ground ginger

#### Method:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas. Grease and line a 900g (2lb) loaf tin
- 2. To make the fruit layer, measure the syrup, butter and sugar into a pan. Gently heat, stirring, until just melted. Add the almonds, cherries, sultanas and ginger pieces and stir until combined. Spoon into the base of the tin.

- 3. To make the sponge, measure all the ingredients into a bowl. Beat together until smooth and combined. Spoon on top of the fruit layer in the tin and spread out evenly.
- 4. Bake for 45 minutes until well risen and lightly golden. Leave to cool for 5 minutes then tip upside down and remove the paper. Cut into slices to serve.

## Recipe for Lemon Drizzle Cake:

#### Ingredients:

- 100g (4oz) soft margarine
- 150g (6oz) caster sugar
- 150g (6oz) self raising flour
- 2 eggs
- 4 tablespoons milk
- Grated rind of 1 lemon

#### Method:

- 1. Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin
- 2. Cream together the margarine and sugar
- 3. Stir in the rest of the ingredients
- 4. Put in tin and smooth the top
- 5. Bake at 170C for 45 mins or until firm

#### Syrup:

- 3 rounded tablespoons of icing sugar
- 3 tablespoons of fresh lemon juice

Mix the syrup and pour over the cake as it comes out of the oven. Leave to cool.
